## SAVE SUMMER JOBS & REACH OUT TO YOUR MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT



Thousands of  
charitable organizations  
are being denied funding  
through the Canada  
Summer Jobs program.

The federal government has introduced a litmus test. To qualify for funding, organizations must agree with the Liberal Government on abortion. This has impacted more than 150 jobs and more than \$1 million in funding in the Archdiocese of Toronto alone. Across Canada 1,500 groups had their applications rejected this year vs. 126 in 2017.

Sorry to have to provide another update so close to the previous one. We have put our construction project out for tender. The several firms who are participating in the tender process have expressed concerns about starting before September.

The concern is that trades will not be overly abundant as they will be tied up on school projects during the summer. This would significantly increase the cost of the project. Reluctantly we have decided to take their guidance and plan to delay construction till the fall.

There are a couple of other obstacles that could arise as we move forward. The project is approved by council but we are still waiting for the papers to be processed by the town. We could also open the tenders near the end of June and find that they are a way over the estimate provided for A. W. Hooker who are cost consultants on the project. We will continue to keep you informed.
