All are invited out to this evening of prayer and reflection.

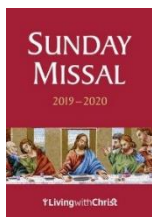

A GENTLE REMINDER TO OUR SENIORS

We are well into fall and snow cannot be far off. Through the winter months of snow and ice we remind the elders of our parish that though we value your presence and love your fidelity to the mass, there are times when it is better to err on the side of caution and not take the risk of coming out to mass.

Venturing out when it is icy can result in falls and serious injury. The younger folks who still have enough padding to absorb a fall will keep your pew warm until those times during the winter when the roads and parking lots are easier to navigate.

MISSALS



Missals will be available again this year on November 16 and 17th. As in other years there is one free to each home. Additional copies we ask you to pay \$5.00 each. Make your payment into the basket by the missals.

What do you do with the old missal? They have not been blessed so they can be put into recycling. We have been assured that the covers are not an issue for recycling.

WHY DO WE GIVE YOU MISSALS?

Some would say it is so you have something to follow along with when the readings are done at mass. That isn't why we give them to you. Others may say, we have them so that we can read the readings before we come to mass on Sunday so we are ready. That isn't why we give you missals.

We are given missals so in the week following Sunday mass we can go back and re-read the readings and think of them in the context of the homily we heard at mass. You are given a missal so that you carry the Sunday experience home.

On Sunday we plant the seeds, during the week you till them.

CHILDREN'S MISSALS

Children's missals are available at a price of \$10.00 each. Just put the payment into the basket near the missals.

There is only a limited number purchased so we encourage you to buy them now so that you do not miss out.

COMMUNION TO ELDERS AND THOSE WITH AMBULATORY CHALLENGES

Over the last three years we have invited elders and those with mobility issues (this may be a teenager with broken leg) to sit in the front pew and at the conclusion of communion we give those folks communion in their pew.

This is not a universal practice of the Church, it is an Aurora practice that shows respect to our elders. In most parishes elders would just shift for themselves.

For this practice to continue we need all elders and all communion ministers to be on the same page. Communion is given to those who come forward and then to those who find it difficult to come forward who are seated in the front pew.

Since we should be able to get back on track, we invite any parishioners with ambulatory issues to sit at the front, when the priest or minister comes along after communion just indicate that you would like to receive. There is nothing to arrange ahead of time and, of course, just relax while the rest of the congregation receive communion, we know you are there.

PARKING LOT INCIDENT
