We would still work with families who want the funeral in a more permanent setting when the need arises.

THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Thank you to all who have responded in the first part of this year. We are still paying our way for the renovations out of what we have on reserve. The more we have on reserve that less debt we will need to carry as the project moves to completion.

YIKES

We seem to be moving ahead in the construction and renovation department. Thank you to everyone for their great cooperation during this time.

We have had one disappointing setback, in that while digging for the new sewage pipes, they found not one but two oil tanks. Both had leaked somewhat, but the problem was addressed in very timely fashion.

We do not know the cost of this unforeseen problem, but it will be between 20 and 50 thousand dollars by the time that the contaminated soil is addressed.

Things seem to have a way of evening themselves out and hopefully we will recover these costs in other parts of the project.

THE BACK DOOR ALONG THE WALKWAY

We will use the back door along the walkway to enter the hall for mass. We caution those with any ambulatory issues to use the ramp facing Catherine Ave.

The step down when leaving is a bit more than what one may plan for and there is no way we can put a handrail without blocking the walkway.
